

Johnsons Nurseries Ltd statement regarding the use of peat

Johnsons Nurseries Ltd has been committed to reducing the use of 100% peat substrate mixes in our production for almost 30 years, for most production a substrate containing 40% peat alternatives is currently used. For certain crops such as Lavandula, a peat-free mix is already in use and in early 2021, trials of peat-free growing media were initiated across a broader range of crops, as the next step towards further reducing our reliance on peat-based substrates.

We have continued to develop our understanding of production in peat-free growing media, we are on track to exceed the legislated date to remove peat from professional Horticulture and expect to be growing exclusively in peat-free substrates by the end of 2026.

To show our commitment to the removal of peat from use in Horticulture we have already removed all peat-based bagged products from sale in our Wholesale Plant Centre and are part of the RHS' Peat Free Fellowship
